The subject of mercy has recently been in the news. When Bishop Mariann Edgar Budde addressed President Trump at a prayer service at the National Cathedral asking him to show mercy, it created quite a stir. Some people thought it was inappropriate for her to ask President Trump to be merciful to LGBTQ (lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and queer) Americans and immigrants living in the United States. Bishop Budde cited the fear each of these groups are experiencing and suggested knowing someone is afraid can evoke mercy. Some people supported Bishop Budde's call for mercy, sharing their belief mercy is part of what God calls pastors to stress.

In thinking about this, I decided to see what the Bible has to say about the subject. The Old Testament established a structure that required deep and divine concern for people who were hungry, poor, or outcasts. This structure was to be a witness to the goodness of God. Deuteronomy 4:5-8 says this: "See, I have taught you statutes and rules, as the Lord my God commanded me, that you should do them in the land you are entering to take possession of it. Keep them and do them for that will be your wisdom and your understanding in the sight of the people, who, when they hear all of these statutes, will say, 'Surely this great nation is a wise and understanding people.' For what great nation has a God so near to it as the Lord our God is to us, whenever we call him? And what great nation is there that has statures and rules so righteous as all the law that I set before you today?" Two things are immediately clear; laws that stressed mercy and empathy are foundational to Judaism and Christianity, and in fact all world religions, and following God's statutes is a witness to God's goodness. The Old Testament prophet spoke out against injustice and condemned the lack of concern for people experiencing hunger and cruelty regardless of what kind of government people were living under. You may read these texts yourself and judge their meaning: Isaiah 32:7, Ezekiel 16:49, Amos 4:1-3, 8:4-7.

The scriptures speak to the role and responsibilities of leaders that govern to care for all people, including people experiencing poverty, and cruelty of all kinds. (Psalm 72, Jeremiah 22, Proverbs 31:8-9) in the New Testament Jesus calls his followers to love their neighbors (Matthew 22:39-40) and warns that nations will be held accountable and will be judged for the ways that they have treated "the least and the lost" among them (Matthew 25:31-46, Zephaniah 3:8-13).

Psalm 72 and Romans 13 emphasize the role and responsibility of leaders. Theses passages suggest that our leaders are servants for good, whether the leaders acknowledge that their authority comes from God. Through his example, the Apostle Paul showed how to

exercise his power as a citizen of Rome. The Apostle spoke out to governments leaders. In **Acts 21-26** we find Christians can also advocate for their governments to protect and to care for all its people.

Here's the thing, I don't see how a Christian can take issue with a pastor focusing on mercy as part of a worship service and sermon. Some argue that it was disrespectful for Bishop Budde to direct her plea for mercy to President Trump. However, President Trump is the most powerful human being in the United States and perhaps the whole world. There was certainly no one else in the room who has more potential to set the tone and path of our country than President Trump. Since a primary role of a pastor is to care for all people, should she have ignored President Trump's importance and need for spiritual guidance?

If anyone directed me to show mercy, I would wonder why they were not also talking to me about showing empathy, kindness, righteousness, hope, peace, love, and grace. But pastors can't say it all in one service or sermon. I don't discount the possibility that the Holy Spirit told Bishop Budde to speak of mercy. In the days of the Old Testament prophets, when the people didn't like what God told the prophets to say, they sometimes stoned the prophets to death. In this controversy, some people are making death threats against Bishop Budde. Some people are also using this controversy to attack women clergy and to point out that they believe women can't really be pastors. I have no time to waste arguing about any of it. I want to go on record: I am 100% in favor of mercy, empathy, kindness, generosity, hope, peace, love, and grace.

We used to live in a country where there were accepted standards of civility, courtesy, kindness, and respect. I miss those times.

To echo the words of Micah 6:8, "God has showed you, O man, what is good. And what does the Lords require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God."

Please pray with me: God of justice and mercy, give us the heart of the prophets as we hold each other accountable to live up to Biblical standards and to follow the example that Jesus gave us. Help us to do unto others as we would have them do unto us. In Jesus' strong name, we pray.
